The CPGC Committee is excited to announce the launch of the Club's new Website.

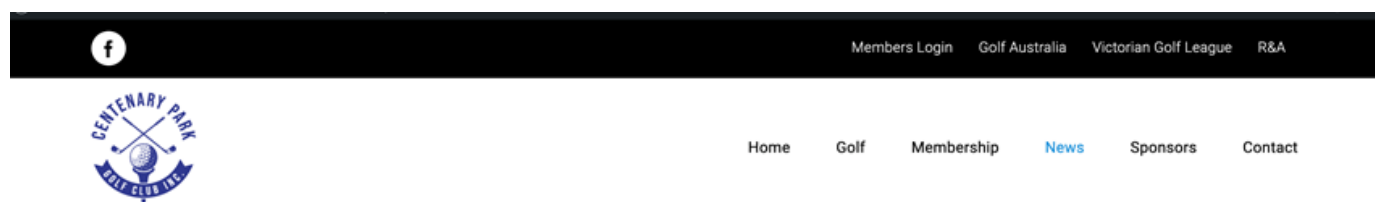
The Website has been updated to provide both members and public details and more importantly events and activities of the Club, hopefully to assist in keeping you all up to date and attracting more new members to our club.

## Test your Rules Knowledge - Answers on Page 5

**Q1.** How many strokes is a General Penalty worth?

- A. One stroke                      B. Two strokes                      C. Disqualification

**Q2.** In stroke play, Paul has teed off the 8<sup>th</sup> and is walking back to his bag when John (who is about to tee off) comments what a great shot he had and asks him what club he used. Paul says he used his 3 wood. What is the ruling?

**Q3.** On the putting green, George marks the ball by holding his putter right next to it. (he does not use a ball marker). He lifts, cleans, and then replaces the ball with the putter in place. What is the ruling

- A. George gets one penalty stroke  
B. There is no penalty  
C. George gets the general penalty, and the ball is played as it lies

**Q4** In stroke play, Leo's ball comes to rest right behind a divot still attached to the fairway. He presses it down and plays his shot. What is the ruling?

- A. There is no penalty    B. Leo gets one penalty stroke    C. Leo gets the general penalty

**Q5.** In stroke play, Alan strikes the sand in frustration after leaving his ball in the bunker with his first stroke. What is the ruling?

- A. There is no penalty    B. Alan gets a penalty of one stroke    C. Alan gets the general penalty

**Q6.** In stroke play, Mark has lost his ball marker and uses a leaf to mark his ball on the putting green. What is the ruling?

**Q7.** In stroke play, Bob finishes the 1st hole, walks to the 2<sup>nd</sup> and practices his putting on the 2<sup>nd</sup> tee box while waiting for the group ahead to clear the green. What is the ruling?

- A. There is no penalty    B. Bob has to buy his playing partner a beer in the club house after the round  
C. Bob gets the general penalty

**Q8** Steve tees off from the 7<sup>th</sup> and his ball lands very close to a GUR sign just off the fairway. It is in the way of making his next stroke. Steve removes the sign and plays his shot. Is this the correct procedure under our local rules?

- A. No                      B. Yes

**Q9.** Michael's ball lands very near a white hose, in the rough on the 4<sup>th</sup>. He cannot make a stroke. Under Rules of Golf, what can Michael do to make his next stroke?

- A. Move the hose and play his ball with no penalty.  
B. Take free relief from the hose at the nearest point of complete relief. The relief area is one club length from the reference point. No penalty.  
C. Take free relief from the hose at the nearest point of complete relief. The relief area is two club lengths from the reference point. No penalty.

**Q10.** Ron tees off at the 11<sup>th</sup>. It looks like his ball may have landed under a thick shrub. Ron and Bill walk up the fairway toward the ball. Bill see's the ball is under the shrub and tells Ron to take relief for a penalty of one stroke as his "ball is unplayable." Is Bill correct?

- A. Yes                      B. No, the penalty is two strokes                      C. No

**Answers:**

**Q1.** General Penalty is a **Two-Stroke Penalty** in Stroke Play or loss of Hole in Match Play. This penalty applies for a breach of most Rules, where the potential advantage is more significant than where only one penalty stroke applies. (Rule 1.3c(2))

**Q2.** Paul and John both get the general penalty. During a round, a player must not ask for advice or give advice to anyone playing in the competition on the course (Rule 10.2a).

**Q3.** B. There is no penalty. It is permissible to hold a club on the ground right next to the ball for marking the spot of a ball to be lifted (Rule 14.1a).

**Q4.** C - Leo gets the general penalty for pressing down a divot and improving the conditions affecting his stroke (Rule 8.1a).

**Q5.** A - There is no penalty. Striking the sand in frustration or anger is not a penalty, if the player has not improved the conditions affecting the stroke.

**Q6.** B Mark gets a penalty of one stroke. A ball marker must be artificial; therefore, it is not permissible to use a loose impediment and it would be a penalty of one stroke for marking a ball in a wrong way (Rule 14.1a).

**Q7.** A There is no penalty. In between holes you are permitted to practice your putting on or near the green of the last hole played and the teeing area of the next hole (Rule 5.5b).

**Q8.** B Yes. However, the GUR sign must be replaced in the same position after Steve has played the ball. (Refer Local Rules)

**Q9.** Move the hose and play his ball with no penalty.

**Q10** C. You are the only person who may decide to treat your ball unplayable during a round. (Rule 19.1). A player must not give advice to anyone playing in the competition on the course (Rule 10.2a). Bill would get a general penalty.
