SOME BASIC RULES

Hitting another Player's Ball

- When your ball hits another on the fairway or rough you must play the ball where it comes to rest. The other player's ball is to be placed in its original position. No Penalty
- When you play your ball from the general area to the green and your ball hits an opponent's ball you must play your ball from where it comes to rest. Your opponent's ball must be placed back on its original spot- No Penalty.
- However if you are on the Green and your ball hits an opponent's ball which is on the green you must play the ball from where it comes to rest and your opponent places their ball back on its original spot. This incurs a 2 shot Penalty on you. It is always better and good golf etiquette to ask someone to make their ball.

Ball in the Bunker

- If your ball is in the bunker next to the rake and when you move the rake your ball moves it must be placed back in its original position.
- If your ball was on the rake, then you must drop the ball in the same position once the rake is removed.

The Flag stick

- You don't have to be on the Green to take the Flag out.

Air Shot

- If you have an air shot, you can only repair the divot after your shot is played.

Rule 19 Unplayable Ball

You are the only person who may decide to treat the ball as unplayable. Unplayable ball relief is allowed anywhere on the course, except in a penalty area.

If you deem your ball unplayable you have three options. In each case it is a one stroke penalty.

1. The player may take stroke-and-distance relief based on where the previous stroke was made.
2. The player may take back-on-the-line relief by dropping the ball in a relief area on a reference line going straight back from the hole through the spot of the original ball
3. The player may take lateral relief. From the spot of the ball, two club lengths from the reference point. The relief area must not be nearer the hole, may be in any area of the course.

Taking Relief

If your ball lands on a path, road or grate for example you can take relief without a penalty. You normally take relief by dropping a ball in a relief area (one club length) based on the nearest point of complete relief. Your stance must be free on the path for example. You can't have your stance fully or partially on the path.

Rule 7.3 Lifting Your Ball to Identify It

If a ball might be yours but you cannot identify it as it lies, you may lift the ball to identify it. But the spot of the ball must be first marked, the ball must not be cleaned more than needed to identify it.

If the lifted ball is your ball or another player's ball, it must be replaced on its original spot.

If you lift the ball when not reasonably necessary to identify it, fail to mark the spot before lifting it, or clean it when not allowed, you get a one shot penalty.
